Lunch – a delightful array of fajita fixings – and morning and afternoon snacks will be provided as part of the cost of registration.

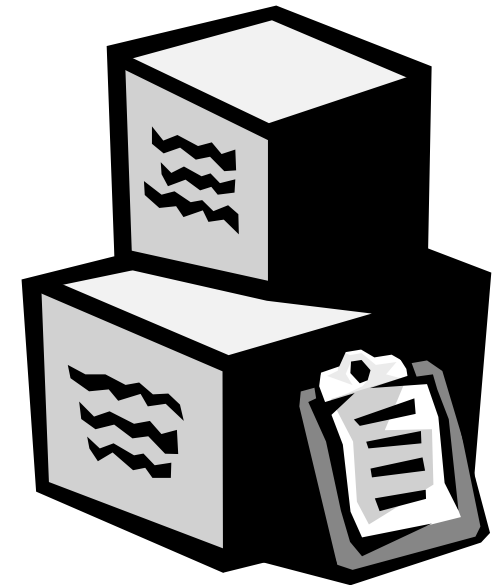
