Legal Issues in the Archive

In the ever-changing digital landscape, navigating copyright law as an archivist has the potential of becoming a hazardous endeavor. At the SRMA Spring Conference, Heather Clark and Anne Marie Lyons from BCR (Bibliographical Center for Research) will present a workshop covering the basic issues of copyright as they pertain to the archives and special collections environment. The workshop will include break-out sessions to allow interaction with peers in real world scenarios. Topics include copyright fundamentals, library and archive exceptions, and fair use evaluations.

The conference will also feature presentations by three niche speakers: Janet Bishop, Bruce Montgomery, and Marilyn Burns. Janet Bishop and Bruce Montgomery, both archivists in university settings, will provide their professional insights regarding legal issues in the archival world. Marilyn Burns, MLIS student with the Emporia SLIM program, will present information from her paper *The Legal Leash: The Application of Copyright Laws to Scanning Archival Records*.

Presenters

Janet Bishop is Coordinator for Archives and Special Collections at Colorado State University. In addition to working at CSU, Janet has held archives, library, and records management positions at Seattle University, the University of Washington, and the Presbyterian Historical Society in Philadelphia. Janet holds a BA in History from Princeton University, a BFA in Graphic Design from the University of Washington, and a MLS from the University of Pittsburgh.

Marilyn Burns is a student at Emporia State University and will be completing her MLIS coursework in 2009. She is currently employed as the office manager for the Epilepsy Foundation of Colorado Donation Center. She received her B.A. in history from CU-Boulder and worked at the CU Libraries Archives for four years as an undergraduate student.

Heather Clark is a member service librarian at BCR. Her primary role is training librarians in issues related to resource sharing, including OCLC software functionality and copyright. She holds an MLIS from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and is currently completing a Certificate in Copyright Leadership and Management through the Center for Intellectual Property at the University of Maryland, University College.

Anne Marie Lyons is the digital initiatives trainer at BCR. Before joining BCR, Anne Marie worked at both the National Security Archive and National Public Radio in Washington D.C. Prior to that, she was a project manager for the New Jersey Digital Highway digital library project at Rutgers University. Anne Marie holds a B.A. in English and an MLIS from Rutgers University.

Bruce Montgomery is Faculty Director of Archives at the University of Colorado at Boulder. He is the founding director of the UCB Human Rights Initiative and a founding member of the International Federation of Human Rights Centers and Archives. He has served as an analyst of classified documents for the U.S. government, and is currently a consultant for the Institute for Defense Analysis to help set up a digital resource center to make available electronic copies of captured al Qaeda, Taliban, and Saddam Hussein-era records. He has authored three books and several articles.
